With the generous support of donors, well-wishers, volunteers, and partners, we have made significant progress toward achieving our goals over the past year through various welfare-based interventions. We are happy to report that many of the projects we initiated have been completed, positively impacting those we serve. We aim to continue building on this progress and make an even more significant difference in the coming year.

Progress and Achievements

This year, we constructed six new classrooms, significantly enhancing the educational infrastructure in our target areas. Additionally, we provided schooling support to 505 underprivileged students, ensuring they access quality education. In a particularly heartwarming achievement, we secured a good home for a semi-orphaned young girl, giving her a safe and nurturing environment to thrive.

We have provided school bags and stationery items to schoolchildren affected by the earthquake in Jajrkot so that they can continue their education. Additionally, we have conducted health and adolescent education sessions and life skills training through interactive sessions like "Hero Girls" and "She Creates" to empower young school-going girls.

Our Bridging Lives Across Borders for Support, Protection, and Reunion Program successfully responded to requests from ISS members regarding tracing, referrals, and kinship care. We organized micro-credit and financial literacy programs to empower women and held an Annual Women's Football Event to promote sportsmanship and teamwork.

Our staff's dedication and innovative projects have profoundly impacted students, women, and communities. This commitment has enabled many to create a better future for themselves, and we are immensely proud of our team's hard work and dedication.

Approach

At CP Nepal, we execute our programs and activities using the theory of change and an appreciative inquiry approach. This means we begin by understanding the requirements of the individuals we intend to assist and then collaborate with them to create practical and scalable solutions. We frequently pause to contemplate and ideate, ensuring that our efforts fulfill the needs of our recipients and bring about a constructive outcome.

Challenges

Despite our achievements, we encountered some obstacles over the past year. Some students were distracted by social media, and some failed their final exams, leading to procrastination and difficulties focusing on their studies. In addition, the COVID-19 pandemic harmed some students' parents' income, further complicating matters. Furthermore, some women required assistance in meeting their loan repayment deadlines.

The Way Forward

Our objectives for the upcoming year are to build on our previous accomplishments, reach more individuals with our programs and activities, enhance educational support for children, provide sanitation and hygiene amenities, encourage sexual and reproductive health, offer economic opportunities and leadership training for women, and promote gender equality through sports and other endeavors.

We are grateful for our donors and partners who support our mission of improving beneficiaries' lives. Our successes and positive changes have been made possible thanks to our board and devoted staff. We couldn't have achieved this without everyone's help.



Students' Ethnicity-023/024




School- Private vs Public-023/024




Students' Gender 023/024



Students' According to Municipality 023/024









SpotLight: Anar Kali- From Bondage to Business Owner



Mrs. Anar Kali Chaudhary is a 46-year-old Yakata Mother's Group member in Gobardiha. She has a family of four: her daughter, her son, her husband, and herself. In the past, she was a bonded slave woman, and both she and her husband did labor work to make ends meet. Her husband worked as a school cleaner, and she built homes and planted crops for landowners. Despite their hard work, they struggled to provide basic needs for their family.

Mrs. Anar Kali joined the mothers' group in 2011. At first, she was shy and hesitant to speak or share her feelings during group meetings. The Mother's Group meetings, led by CP staff, focused on saving money, taking loans, education, and business. Inspired by these lessons, Anar Kali decided to start her own business.



In 2014, she took a microcredit loan, bought a piglet, and paid for her husband's work visa to work abroad. In 2015, she sold the pig for 30,000 RS, repaid her loan, and had money left over to buy another piglet.

By 2016, her husband returned to Nepal, and with his earnings, they built a brick home. They then started a more significant business and took another loan of 50,000 RS. With this money and their savings, they opened an electrician shop. Anar Kali sold electrical parts, and her husband worked as an electrician. They began to earn a good income and could provide for their family more comfortably. Anar Kali also earned money from sewing when she wasn't busy with customers.



In 2023, Anar Kali took another loan of 150,000 RS from the COOP to expand their business by opening a grocery shop. Now, her daughter helps in the grocery shop, and her husband continues working in the electrician shop. They repay their loans on time and are no longer worried about financial burdens. Both their children are doing well in their studies. They no longer need our support.



Anar Kali's daughter, Sanjita, is awaiting her BBS 4th-year results, and her son is studying electronic engineering. Her husband used to drink alcohol and argue about money, but now they are a happy family. They are very thankful for this opportunity.



From Mothers' Group Member to Successful Entrepreneur



Mrs. Premlali Chaudhary is a shining example of perseverance and success. She is a dedicated member of the Samraxn Mother Group, having joined in 2008. Before her involvement with the mother group, Mrs. Premlali and her husband worked in other people's homes, struggling to make ends meet. The turning point came when Her International's program supported her daughter's education. Motivated by this support, Mrs. Premlali also joined the mother group. As her daughter started attending school, Mrs. Premlali stayed home to care for her children. Alongside her domestic responsibilities, she began attending mother group meetings and took up farming, believing that even those with limited resources could start their own business and earn a living.

In 2010, Mrs. Premlali took a loan of Rs. 3,000 from the group to purchase a goat and embarked on a goat-breeding venture. Initially, she was anxious about repaying the loan due to the lack of immediate income. However, after three months, she managed to repay the loan through labor work. Within a year, the goat gave birth to a kid, marking the beginning of her successful venture. She was thrilled to see her hard work paying off and considered the two goats her earnings, having cleared her debt.

2012, Mrs. Premlali borrowed an additional R.S. 2,000 from the group to kickstart her vegetable cultivation venture. She used the vegetable leaves to feed her goats and sold the surplus produce, establishing a stable income stream. This newfound revenue source ignited her drive and entrepreneurial spirit. Gradually, Mrs. Premlali repaid old debts, obtained new loans, and diversified her income streams. She oversees a varied portfolio comprising buffaloes, goats, and vegetable farming. Her annual earnings include R.s. 95,000 from milk, R.s. 60,000 from vegetables, and R.s. 30,000 from goats, totaling R.s. 1,85,000. This income covers her family's medical expenses, household necessities, and children's education.



Her daughter, supported by the "Empowerment Through Education Program", is currently pursuing a B.B.S. degree and is in her third year. Her son is studying for a B.Sc. degree and is currently in his second year. Mrs. Premlali proudly supports her son's education with her earnings. She reflects, "After HI helped my daughter get an education, I was determined that my son should also go to school. Now, both of my children are in higher education and are doing well. My son aspires to be a science teacher, while my daughter aims to become a bank manager. Though the rising costs of education and other expenses have been challenging, I am grateful for the ability to provide my children with a good education. If HI had not assisted my daughter, I would still be working in others' homes, and my children would not have had the opportunities they have today. I am deeply thankful for the support I received." Mrs. Premlali Chaudhary's story is a testament to the transformative power of support and determination, illustrating how dedicated individuals can overcome challenges and achieve success.

From Student to Teacher and Future Public Servant





Despite the financial challenges her family has faced, they have found happiness in their achievements. Through hard work, they transformed their mud house into a sturdy brick home.

Arjun's family consists of seven members. Her brother is dedicated to civil engineering, and her father is a carpenter who also supports the family through agriculture. The entire family is content and grateful, having faced no significant hardships. They owe much of their progress to the support from the program, for which they are deeply thankful.

SpotLight: Rajani Kumal Chaudhary



23-year-old Rajani Chaudhary is in her first year of a bachelor's degree, standing out among her friends for her maturity and hardworking nature. Rajani is multi-talented; she excels in dancing, drawing, and managing various household chores

Each morning, Rajani attends her classes and then heads to a bank for an internship, gaining practical experience related to her studies. She returns home by 5 PM, taking on household responsibilities, including cooking and helping her brother's children with their homework. Her days are a blend of learning and domestic duties.

Despite financial challenges, Rajani and her family remain happy. Her two brothers work in India, and she harbors big dreams for the future. For the past 12 years, Rajani has received financial support, which has been crucial for her and her family. This support has allowed Rajani to pursue her education and significantly contribute to her household, maintaining discipline and improving their home life.

Rajani and her family are deeply grateful to our organization for this support. This assistance has significantly improved their situation, making the family healthier and more content.

Rajani's determination and resilience have been the driving forces behind her accomplishments. She excels in her studies, often staying up late into the night to complete her assignments and prepare for exams. Her hard work has not gone unnoticed, as she has consistently ranked among the top students in her class.

देउखुरी । सुशीला चौधरीको घर मझेरीमा पर्छ । गृहिणीको भूमिमा रहनुभएकी सुशीला तीन दिन फुटवल खेल खेल्न मैदानमा उत्रिनुभयो । उहाँले फुटवल छोएको पहिलो पटक हो । यसरी चुलो चौकोमा सीमित महिलाहरू मैदानमा उत्रिएर फुटवलमा रमाउन पाएकोमा दंग छन् । 'सानैमा कम्मरी बस्ने चलन थियो । त्यो चलन त हट्यो । अहिलेका छोरीहरू कम्मरी बस्नुपर्दैन । तर पहिला बसेका आमा, दिदीहरू यसरी खुलेर रमाउन पाउनु भएको थिएन । फुटवल प्रतियोगिताले नयाँ ऊर्जा थप्यो' - उहाँले भन्नुभयो- 'खेलको माध्यमबाट पनि प्रेरणा लिन सकिदोरहेछ ।' आमा समूहमा आवद्ध महिलाहरूको बीचमा फुटवल प्रतियोगिता आयोजना गरेर महिला सशक्तिकरणमा जोड दिइएको छ । कति बस्छौं चुला चौकामा, आउ बाहिर रमाउ खेलमा मुख्य सन्देशसहित गढवामा पाँचौं महिला फुटवल प्रतियोगिता गरिएको हो ।

क्रियटिङ पोसिविलिटिज नेपालले स्थानीय तहसँग सहकार्य गरेर आयोजना गरेको फुटवल प्रतियोगितामा २८ वर्षदेखि ५५ वर्ष उमेर समूहका आमाहरू सहभागी भए । तीनवटा स्थानीय तह गढवा गाउँपालिका, राप्ती गाउँपालिका र राजपुर गाउँपालिकाका एक सय चारजना आमाहरूले खेलमा भाग लिएका थिए । विगत पाँच वर्षदेखि निरन्तर रूपमा महिलाहरूको बीचमा फुटवलको माध्यमबाट सहकार्यको भावनाको विकास गराउँदै आएको छ । समुदायमा मिलेर बस्नुपर्ने, खेलमा बल पास दिएझैं एक अर्काका साथीको विकास मानेर सहकार्यमा काम गरेपछि सफल हुन सकिन्छ भन्ने उदाहरण दिन सफल भएको क्रियटिङ पोसिविलिटिज नेपालका निर्देशक दिनेशराज सापकोटाले बताउनु भयो । 'मुक्त कम्मरीका आमाहरू समूहमा बस्नुभएको छ । उहाँहरूलाई सशक्तिकरण गर्न हामीले खेललाई माध्यम बनाएका हौं । यो माध्यम प्रभावकारी भएको छ' - उहाँले भन्नुभयो- 'गाउँघरका आमाहरू पनि फुटवल खेल्न सक्छन् भन्ने आत्मविश्वास जगाउन सफल भयौं । चुली चौकामा सीमित हुनुभन्दा रमाउन माध्यम पनि फुटवल बन्यो ।' राजपुर गाउँपालिकाका उपाध्यक्ष धनपतिदेवी यादव पनि फुटवलमा खेलाडी बनेर भाग लिनुभयो । उहाँसँगै अन्य गाउँका महिलाहरू पनि सहभागी भएर खेल खेल्दा सकारात्मक अनुभूति भएको प्रतिक्रिया उपाध्यक्ष यादवको छ । 'एकलो प्रयासले सफलता प्राप्त गर्न सकिदैन । हामीले सबैसँग सहकार्य गर्नुपर्ने सफलता प्राप्त गर्न सक्छौं भन्ने उदाहरण हो' - उहाँले भन्नुभयो- 'गाउँ-गाउँका दिदिबहिनीहरूलाई फुटवलले जोडेको पाउँ । निरन्तर प्रतियोगिता हुँदै आएको छ । यसले खेल संस्कार, अनुशासन पालना गर्ने मद्दत गरेको महसुस गरेको छु ।'


